City Council Updates

Addison Officers Recognized for with Life Saving Awards





At the December 10 City Council meeting, Police Chief Chris Freis recognized Addison Police Officers for their heroic actions in two separate incidents that saved lives.

On July 25, 2024, Officers Sidwell and Tingue were patrolling the 4200 block of Belt Line Road when they found an unconscious woman in a vehicle. Suspecting an overdose, they administered two doses of Narcan, reviving her and preventing a likely fatal outcome.

That same day, Officers Sidwell and Cearlock responded to a 911 call reporting an unconscious man at Motel 6. Upon arrival, they administered two doses of Narcan to the man, who had ingested Fentanyl. Their quick response and teamwork restored the man to consciousness, saving his life.

The officers' professionalism, awareness, and commitment to the Addison community were commended, with both incidents highlighting the importance of proactive and compassionate policing. Thank you to Officers Sidwell, Tingue, and Cearlock for their continued commitment to Addison.

Addison Circle Park Vision Plan Presented to Council



At the December 10 City Council meeting, representatives from OJB Landscape Architecture unveiled the Addison Circle Park Vision Plan. Driven by a desire to be Authentically Addison, this plan reimagines the park as a vibrant, inclusive, and sustainable space that fosters community connections and celebrates Addison's unique identity.

The Advisory Committee developed the following Vision Plan Statement to guide their efforts:

"Our vision for the re-imagined Addison Circle Park is to build upon the success and innovation of the original park, fostering growth and evolution. We aim to create a welcoming, vibrant, inclusive, and sustainable space that enriches the lives of all residents and visitors. Our vision is to encourage community connections, embrace innovation, and celebrate nature."

The plan's objectives are:

- Design for year-round activities and events of all sizes.
- Increase daily visitorship and encourage visitors to linger longer.
- Integrate the park with surrounding developments and venues, treating Addison Circle Park and the Conference and Theatre Centre as a cohesive unit.
- Preserve areas essential for Addison's signature events while enhancing spaces for recurring programming.

The metrics of success include a commitment to a robust activation plan of free programs and events, achieving a Level 1 arboretum certification, complementing surrounding venues, supporting local businesses, and maintaining operational excellence.

La Parisienne French Bistro Coming to Village on the Parkway



At its December 10 meeting, the City Council approved a Special Use Permit for La Parisienne French Bistro, a full-service restaurant offering a chic Parisian dining experience. La Parisienne will combine two currently vacant spaces in Village on the Parkway, 5100 Belt Line Road, to create a 4,804-square-foot restaurant with an additional 600-square-foot outdoor patio.

This new addition to Addison will serve brunch, lunch, dinner, and daily tea service, with plans to host live saxophone and jazz performances on weeknights. With seating for 191 guests and a menu that reflects the charm of Paris, La Parisienne is set to become a must-visit destination. This will be the second location for La Parisienne, following its successful debut at The Star in Frisco.

Council Appoints Members to Airport Master Plan Steering Committee

In July, the Council approved a \$1,050,000 Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grant from the FAA, administered by TxDOT Aviation, to fund a comprehensive update of Addison Airport's Master Plan. This funding includes a 10% matching share of \$105,000 from the Airport Fund.

To guide the Master Plan update, two committees will oversee the process. The Executive Committee, consisting of the consultant team, staff, and TxDOT Aviation representatives, will handle the project's administration and management. The Project Steering Committee (PSC), will provide a platform for public participation and input. At the December 10 City Council meeting, each Council member selected two representatives to serve on the PSC. These Council appointments will join 12 airport business representatives selected by staff to create the 26-member committee.

The Master Plan update emphasizes public engagement to shape the future of Addison Airport. There will be several opportunities for public input during the development of the updated plan.
