City Council Updates

New Mural Approved for Vitruvian Park Area



At its December 10 meeting, the Addison City Council approved a Meritorious Exception request from UDR, Inc. to allow a 14-foot tall by 11-foot wide mural on the northeast facade of Savoy 2, an apartment building located at 3900 Vitruvian Way. This vibrant mural will highlight elements found in Vitruvian Park and be visible from Vitruvian Way.

Council Reviews Legislative Priorities

At its December 10 meeting, the Council reviewed the Town's draft legislative priorities in preparation for the 89th Texas Legislative Session, which begins in January 2025. These priorities serve as a guide to protect and enhance Addison's municipal interests, signal key policy areas, and provide direction to Town staff for advocacy efforts during the session.

The Town's legislative priorities emphasize protecting local authority, maintaining financial stability, supporting economic development tools, and advocating for transportation and mobility funding. These priorities will shape Addison's collaboration with our state delegation, including Senator Tan Parker (Senate District 12) and Representative Cassandra Hernandez (House District 115), as well as organizations such as the Texas Municipal League, North Central Texas Council of Governments, and Metrocrest Chamber of Commerce.

Addison Community Shares Thoughts on Public Art



The Town of Addison recently facilitated a public art survey for the Addison Arbor Foundation to gather community feedback about public art in Addison. The Town plans to develop a Public Art Master Plan in the near future and there will be additional opportunities for public

input as part of that process.

Of the 140 respondents to the Arbor Foundation's survey, 88% are Addison residents and the remaining either work in or are visitors to the town. The survey results revealed the following insights:

- Public Art's Importance: 80% of respondents believe public art is an important or very important element of Addison's parks, open spaces, and overall town image.
- Funding Sources: 71% of respondents support funding public art from multiple sources, including the Town, citizen donations, business contributions, and non-profit fundraising.
- Preferred Art Styles: Kinetic art was the most favored style currently in Addison, though all styles received positive feedback.
- Top Choices for Future Installations: Respondents selected the following art styles as their top choices for future installations:
 - 1. Whimsical
 - 2. Contemporary, special effects/lighting, kinetic, realistic, themed, and mixed media
 - 3. Mosaics, interactive, and stone
- Preferred Locations for Future Projects: Respondents indicated the following areas were preferred for future installations:
 - 1. The Les Lacs Area
 - 2. Addison Circle District and Redding Trail
 - 3. The Quorum Art Walk, Vitruvian, and Addison Grove

The survey also revealed that while 73% of participants have seen more than 10 of Addison's public art installations, many were unaware of the **Otocast App**, which provides details about the collection. To address this, the Town is planning signage to raise awareness of the app.

Participants also shared valuable feedback and suggestions to enhance Addison's public art experience. Thank you to all who took the time to share their insights.
