Council Updates

Council Adopts Fiscal Year 2025 Budget



Following a second public hearing at its September 10 meeting, the City Council approved the Town of Addison's Annual Budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 and approved a tax rate of \$0.609822 per \$100 of valuation which is the same as the FY 2023 and 2024 tax rate.

Of the total tax rate, \$0.439822 is dedicated to maintenance and operations, which is a decrease of over one cent from the Fiscal Year 2024 tax rate for maintenance and operations, and \$0.170000 is dedicated to debt service payments. The debt service portion of the tax rate is increasing due to the issuance of Certificates of Obligations and loans from the State Infrastructure Bank which are replacing funding that was approved by voters in the 2019 Bond Election at a lower borrowing cost.

The new budget takes effect on October 1 and includes the following significant items:

- \$138,409 for a Theatre Manager position as recommended by the Theatre vision study
- \$175,000 for Kellway Pump Station Maintenance
- \$163,375 for a Construction Inspector
- \$110,000 for Airport GIS Contractual Services
- \$196,000 for Parks Planned Asset Replacement
- \$30,000 for mental health screenings for Fire Department
- \$100,000 for Neighborhood Vitality Grant Funding
- \$156,000 for Local Trail Connection and Park Schematic Design
- \$248,000 for Wayfinding Signage Master Plan

The FY 2025 proposed capital improvements budget totals \$51.02 million. Significant projects include:

- Vitruvian West Streetscape and Bella Lane Extension (\$0.90 million)
- Keller Springs Reconstruction (\$8.00 million)
- Les Lacs Pond Improvements (\$4.38 million)
- Vitruvian Park Phase 6, Block 301, 302, and 303 Improvements (\$1.90 million)
- Quorum Drive Reconstruction (\$10.00 million)
- Monfort Drive Reconstruction (\$4.19 million)
- Beltway Drive Trail (\$1.70 million)
- Airport Road Reconstruction (\$3.40 million)
- North Texas Emergency Communications (NTECC) Facility (\$0.20 million)
- AAC Outdoor Pool Restrooms/Perimeter Fence Renovations (\$0.60 million)
- Westgrove & Quorum Bicycle Lanes and Airport Viewing Area (\$0.56 million)
- Police and Courts Facility (\$3.50 million)
- Service Center Lobby Renovations (\$0.23 million)
- Arapaho Road/Surveyor Boulevard and Systemwide Traffic Signal Improvements (\$0.22 million)
- Conference Center Renovations (\$1.50 million)
- AMI Water Meter Modernization (\$3.15 million)
- Reconstruction of Jimmy Doolittle Drive (\$1.00 million)
- Eastside Airport Service Road Reconstruction (\$1.49 million)
- Airport Fuel Storage Expansion (\$3.37 million)

Council Authorizes Issuance of Bonds

At its September 10 meeting, the City Council authorized the issuance of Certificates of Obligation for the following projects:

- \$3,400,000 for construction of a new 23,000 square foot public safety communications facility for the joint dispatch center created and owned by the Cities of Coppell, Farmers Branch, and Carrollton along with the Town.
- \$1,150,000 for a replacement Spartan Fire Engine.
- \$850,000 for Addison Grove incentive payments for public infrastructure. Town staff anticipates that Addison Grove will qualify for the first two incentive payments in late 2024 or early 2025. Each incentive payment is \$2,083,333. The Town set aside \$3,000,000 between fiscal years 2017 and 2019 to cash fund half the incentive payments. To date, those funds have earned slightly over \$300,000 in interest.
- \$5,300,000 for Stormwater Fund capital improvement projects supported and serviced by Stormwater Fund revenue. These projects include reconstruction of Keller Springs Road (\$2,800,000) and Les Lacs Pond Improvements (\$2,500,000)

The bonds were issued for 20 years with an interest rate of approximately 3.58% as well as a premium of \$804,213 which resulted in a lower principal issuance amount of \$10,015,000. After payment of bond issuance costs, the Town will still receive the \$10,700,000 million in project funds needed for these projects. Addison is one of only 11 cities in Texas with a AAA with both Moody's and S&P.

While classic Oktoberfest favorites like Paulaner bier, authentic German food, and great entertainment return this year, here are just a few of the changes festival-goers can look forward to at this German Fare with a Texas Flair:

• Host and Prost Networking event takes over the Partyhalle on Thursday night.

- New Party Zelt tent features another original Oktoberfest bier, Hacker Pschorr, plus live entertainment from bands like Brave Combo.
- The theatre entrance will be the backdrop for a live Glockenspiel.
- The carnival makes a come back.
- Kaffe and Kuchen expands and takes over the Stone Cottage.
- The Biercadia arcade can be found in the Theatre lobby, while the Stiefel Studio silent disco takes up residence in the Studio Theatre.
- A new Texas Prost stage will be located in the heart of the north lawn, while the Lederhosen Lounge can be found in the courtyard between the Theatre and Conference Centre (and will offer music with a more of a Texas flair).
- A carousel on the main plaza, right next to the Hof Play kids area and root biergarten.
- There's not a bad seat in the house for the games this year with the addition of stadium seating.

New Murals Planned for Exterior of Austin's Bar-B-Que





Council approved a Meritorious Exception for Austin's Bar-B-Que at its September 10 meeting to allow for the installation of three murals on the east and west facades of their restaurant, located at the northwest corner of Addison Road and Keller Spring Road. The murals will cover a total area of 285 square feet (Sign A: 9 ft x 18 ft, Sign B: 3.75 ft x 12 ft, and Sign C: 6.85 ft x 11.33 ft). The artwork is non-commercial, featuring Texas-themed imagery such as a Texas longhorn. The murals will be visible from both Addison Road and Keller Spring Road.

Because the transfer goes through two different networks (Spectrum and ATT) before it reaches NTECC, we've had several outages recently. DART Hosts Annual General Meeting in Addison



During the recent General Meeting at the Renaissance Dallas Addison Hotel, attended by the Addison City Council and City Manager, DART President & CEO Nadine Lee delivered her second annual State of the Agency address. Lee announced that transit-oriented developments within the DART service area generated nearly \$1 billion in direct spending and created 11,000 jobs between 2019 and 2021, according to a study by the University of North Texas Economic Research Group.

The study, led by Dr. Michael Carroll, assessed real estate development within a quarter-mile radius of DART stations, highlighting the economic benefits these developments bring to the region. The event, sponsored by Archer Western Construction, also featured Addison Mayor Bruce Arfsten and DART Board Chair Gary Slagel as speakers.

Addison Remembers 9/11



On Wednesday, September 11, the Addison Fire Department hosted a 9/11 memorial service. Back before radios and pagers, bell tolls were used by fire departments to communicate. Honoring this treasured tradition, AFD used its bell to recognize those fallen first responders who lost their lives 23 years ago as a result of the 9/11 tragedy.
